NEW ITEM

Recipe Rabbit and sausage hotpot serves 4

Ingredients 350g/12oz Sausage meat 1 rabbit (or Chicken) jointed 1 large red onion, chopped Salt and pepper to taste Chicken stock 75g/3oz breadcrumbs 25g/1oz butter Method

Spread $\frac{1}{2}$ the sausage meat on the base of a pie dish, place the rabbit or chicken joints on top and sprinkle with the chopped onion, salt and pepper Cover with the rest of the sausage meat. Half fill the dish with the stock. Sprinkle the breadcrumbs over the top and press down firmly. Dot with butter, cover with tinfoil and bake in a preheated oven (150C/300F Gasmark 2) for $1\frac{1}{2}$ hrs. 15 mins before the cooking time is up, remove the foil and brown the top.

Serve with mashed potatoes, carrots and peas or cabbage.
