Presidents Message

Since the last Tidings we have seen the passing of one of the Clubs most respected members in Bill Dance. Bill was a past Captain on two occasions, plus he had the honour of also being Captain at Belmont.

I always remember that a very good friend of ours David Dalby, had a very deep respect for Bill. Sue and I have an enduring memory of Bill as a fellow attendee at a Murder Mystery party at David's house. Like us, Bill and Margaret dressed up for the part and we still have the photos for our memory.

Like many of you, I attended Bill's Funeral at Barham on Christmas Eve. It was nice to hear the tribute to Bill's service during those dark days of the Second World War. For those of you that were not able to attend the service I include a brief summary of that period.

Bill was involved in engineering during the early part of the war but then volunteered in 1943 to serve in the RAF. He was quickly recognised as officer material and after training, served as a Flight Lieutenant responsible for a six man crew. Bill's most difficult mission was his involvement in the taking of the Rhine. On the 24th March 1945 he flew his Handley Page Halifax of 644 Squadron, towing a Glider full of troops and equipment on the assault. This also involved thousands of other forces from our allies. The whole operation was a success but the squadron lost two Halifax's. Overall the allies suffered 1100 Dead, 1,625 wounded and the loss 50 aircraft and 11 gliders. It makes you appreciate what they did for us all.

Bill's squadron was based at Tarrant Rushton near Blandford Forum and also took a significant role in supplying the SOE and SAS who were working behind the lines in France, Belgium and Holland.

Bill then left the service in 1947 to return to Engineering, the do say that if he had stayed in the RAF he would have achieved an even higher rank. If you want to look up further information, see the internet for Operation Varsity for the Rhine mission and 644 squadron for Bill's Squadron.

To conclude I would like to wish you a happy and prosperous New Year. John.

We regularly get claims from our neighbours relating to damage caused by golf balls to their property. This is a significant cost to the Club as we have a £350 Excess applicable to this type of Insurance claim, and not many claims exceed this.

Recently there has been a dramatic increase in the number of claims for no obvious reasons — which have come from all sides of the course but mainly from the caravan park where there are often children playing Please ensure that you shout fore loudly, apologise to those affected and report every incident in the relevant book in the foyer.

Clubhouse Hire

The clubhouse can be hired by members for events such as a birthday party . First call should be with the Club Steward and /or the Office to check availability. There is a hire form that needs to be filled out (copies are available from the office) in advance of the event. Our caterers are to be used for any food requirements.

There is a charge for hire of £100.
