These rates reflect a small rise, which is line with inflation - the full members annual rate last year was £576.00. Our rates remain very competitive compared with other clubs in the area, the lowest being Westgate at £725.00.

As agreed these rates are not affected by the fees that have been incurred in connection with the development project concerning the sale of land and the new clubhouse – which have been paid from reserves.

Monthly payments must be paid directly to the Club by standing order from the member's bank or building society. There is an additional charge of £2 per month to cover the additional administration costs involved.

The age categories are calculated as at 1st April 2016

#### PROPERTY DAMAGE ON AND OFF THE COURSE

We regularly get claims from our neighbours relating to damage caused by golf balls to their property. This is a significant cost to the Club as we have a £350 Excess applicable to this type of Insurance claim, and not many claims exceed this.

Recently there has been a dramatic increase in the number of claims for no obvious reasons – which have come from all sides of the course but mainly from the caravan park where there are often children playing Please ensure that you shout fore loudly, apologise to those affected, and report every incident in the relevant book in the foyer.

There has also been a lot of damage to the course and signage by vandals in the form of local kids, we have permission from the police to take photos of any children on our property committing acts of vandalism.

#### Clubhouse Hire

The clubhouse can be hired by members for events such as a birthday party . First call should be with the Club Steward and /or the Office to check availability. There is a hire form that needs to be filled out (copies are available from the office) in advance of the event. Our caterers are to be used for any food requirements.

There is a charge for hire of £100.

## **Green Keepers Report**

Green Report February 2016

<u>Greens</u>

Due to a virtually non-existent winter the greens have continued to grow steadily thus requiring mowing at a height of cut of 6mm. They are in a healthy condition with no disease issues. I will be aerating them with the slit tiner when or if we get some drier weather. The weather has been so mild most of the time that we have continued to see casting from the microscolex worms. As normal during the winter I have had to regularly repaid damage from seagulls on the 2<sup>nd</sup> green.

#### General

Bunker repairs on holes 4, 6 & 7 have been completed as has the refurbished back tee on number 5. All these areas will be back in play when the white tees go back out in March.

Worn areas around the clubhouse area have been repaired. Also a number of sink holes have been raised on holes 1,3,7 & 9 and more are planned when conditions are dry enough. Astroturf pathways have been laid through previously wet areas on the 2<sup>nd</sup> carry and to the right of the 8<sup>th</sup> green. Drainage is planned on holes 4, 5 & 8 during maintenance week in September. Once installed we intend to drain the wettest area on the 4<sup>th</sup> green plus the approach which will enable this green to be played more often in the winter wet periods in the future.

#### **Ongoing Work**

Drainage plans 2016. After 4<sup>th</sup> green inspection and other areas we have identified 5<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> Fairway and the green and approach at the 4<sup>th</sup>. In maintenance week the drainage contractor will install a long drain in front of the 4<sup>th</sup> 2 short lateral drains will be installed by the greens staff from the front edge of the green to the newly installed drain. A further long lateral drain will be installed into the heart of the green and connected to the new drain. This part of the work will need to be carried out in dry weather therefore a 1/2 day closure could be necessary. 26/27/28<sup>th</sup> July earmarked as suitable. All the railway fencing along the 5<sup>th</sup> will be replaced by mid-March.

#### A.O.B.

The family of the late George Bawden have donated £100 to the club which will be used to plant more gorse between the  $1^{\text{st}}$  and  $2^{\text{nd}}$  fairway's. New club information sign has been received and will be installed shortly. After a spate of vandalism phots have been taken of the culprits and sent to the police. Members are asked to photograph any further perpetrators and give to the secretary.

Discussion took place regarding the closure of the 1<sup>st</sup> green on Sunday 21<sup>st</sup> February. There were 3 areas of soft ground, 2 on the approach and 1 on the green. The green staff deemed it unsuitable for 36 people to play the green twice. More damage could have been caused leading to longer green closure. This decision forms part of the "active course management policy" used for the last 12 years.

Next meeting will be on the Tuesday 26th April 2016.
