Green Keepers Report December 2016

Greens

The height of cut is now set at the winter bench setting of 6mm. The greens have been deeply slit on two occasions recently and remain in healthy condition. During the winter they are sprayed on a monthly basis with an

iron solution, which improves presentation and hardens off the turf as a protection against possible disease infection. General

The extensive prolonged dry period continues to amaze me. Apart from a three week period at the beginning of November we have virtually been in a drought situation here in Whitstable since the beginning of July. Despite this the contractor managed to vertidrain all the fairways and selected other areas in October. Following this work we divotted all the fairways and also topped up sunken drainage channels. All the drainage work that has been completed has yet to be tested but I am hopeful that it will improve matters when required. Drainage pipe has been installed on the 4th green and 5th and 8th fairways with the latter areas also mole ploughed along with areas on the 3rd, 7th and 9th fairways.

In recent weeks we have refurbished bunkers on the 6th and 7th and removed fairy ring contaminated turf besides greens numbers 1, 2 and 5. This latter work involves removing infected areas and replacing with fresh root zone and turf. We are also smoothing out sunken areas around greens by removing turf, making good the levels with root zone and replacing the original turf. The borehole is now in place and plumbed in. I am very happy that we are now in the position of being unaffected by any drought restrictions orders in the future.

We have laid new Astroturf on the path besides the $10^{\mbox{th}}$ tee to eradicate the slip hazard.
