Men's Section - Captain Gary Morgan, Vice Captain Howard Gordon

John Stokes and Ian Horton will represent the Club in the next stages of the Daily Mail Foursomes competition following their win in the qualifier played early this month. They finished with a solid 39 points and might have won by a larger margin after an impressive 21 points on their outward nine.

John Wegner and Andy Selwood finished strongly with 21 points on their back nine but started poorly and with a total of just 38 points had to settle for the runners up prize.

In the May Medal, it was Dean Amos who posted best sore on the day to finish outright winner. Despite a triple bogie on eleven he followed that with a birdie on twelve and then played steadily to finish with an excellent net 63 total. A group of three players ended with net 64 totals, though it was classy Lloyd Foster who sneaked the runners up slot ahead of Mark Payne.

Club Captain Gary Morgan found himself in a strong position in the Canterbury Cup 36 hole medal competition, after he finished the morning round with a net 61. Rob Mumby, Steve Chambers and Dave Williams were very much in touch at this stage within just two shots of the leader. Michael Found posted best score of the afternoon but his net 62 wasn't good enough to overtake the main contenders and he had to settle for fourth place overall. At the finish it was Rob Mumby, who had played consistently well throughout the day, who clinched the main prize with a net 62 in the morning and a net 63 in afternoon. David Williams had a good day too and finished in second place with net 128 total. Gary Morgan was unable to match his morning success and and finished in a disappointing third place overall with a net 129 total for the day. The Canterbury Cup was the third Committee Cup event played this year and at this stage in the competition David Williams is in the lead with 16 points. Following Rob Mumby's win in the Canterbury Cup, he is sharing second place on 12 points with Ian Horton and Brian Wild. In the Captain's Swindle played on the last Sunday, Rob Mumby continued to demonstrate his good form with a fabulous 44 points. Tony Hart must have thought his excellent 41 points would be good enough but at the finish he had to settle for second place. Dave Rigden did particularly well to finish in third place with 40 points.

REMINDER TO MEMBERS & VISITORS WHEN YOU HIT A GOLF BALL OUTSIDE THE COURSE

On Tuesday 17th January 2017 a person playing the 6th hole hit a golf ball over the boundary fence and beach huts to the left side of the green. The golf ball hit a local lady resident and narrowly missed the ladies grand daughter, whilst they were walking along the footpath on the sea wall.

This is a very serious incident and could have caused a major injury to the child in question.

The matter was advised to the Club by the local resident. As well as being a very narrow miss to causing serious injury, the lady was very unhappy with the attitude of the persons in group that were involved in hitting the shot.

We have checked the incident book held in the clubhouse and note that no entry was made in the book regarding the incident. Whilst it is easy to say that the ball in this instance was hit by a visitor, we remind all members should enter incidents in the book held in the lobby of the clubhouse without fail.

The implications to the club are great and could cause great cost to us, bad publicity and even prosecution.

We take great pride in our golf course and the friendly attitude that is very much part of being a member here. Members (and guests of members) must take responsibility for actions on the course, and be polite if in conversation with a member of the public who could have just had a golf ball fall near them whilst walking just outside our boundary.

Also they need to ensure that the incident book is filled in without fail.

New Local Rule

Drainage Channels and Cracks on Fairways, Preferred lies are being introduced as follows:

A ball lying on a closely mown area may be marked, lifted, cleaned and placed within 6 inches not nearer the hole than where it originally lay and not in a hazard or on a putting green. A player may place his ball only once and is in play when it has been placed (rule 20.4) If the player fails to mark the position of the ball before lifting it, moves the ball marker prior to putting the ball back in play, or moves the ball in any other manner such as rolling it with a club they incur a 1 shot penalty.

N.B. 'Closely mown area' means any area of the course including paths through the rough, cut to fairway height or less.

Clubhouse Hire

The clubhouse can be hired by members for events such as birthday parties.

First call on dates should be with the Club Steward and/or the Office to check and whether the clubhouse is free for booking. There is a form that needs to be filled; copies are available from the office. The form needs to be returned at least two weeks before the event.

Our caterers are to be used for ANY food requirements.

There is charge of £125 for hire.
