FROM THE OFFICE

John Stokes has now taken over the day to day administration of the Office in conjunction with Fran Price. He has also now taken over as Club Secretary but Brian Best will remain as Company Secretary of Seasalter Golf Club Ltd until he retires in November.

BOREHOLE

The Board has now given the go ahead for the installation of a bore-hole close to the water storage tank, and work will start in September and will take approximately 2 weeks to complete.

A test bore was carried out in 2014 and water samples were analysed which proved satisfactory for irrigation purposes and confirmed that the water was not saline.

The water from the borehole will only be used for irrigation purposes and mains water will continue to be supplied to the clubhouse. The borehole will not only save money but will also allow us to continue to irrigate the course in the event of future drought restrictions applying.

PLANNING PERMISSION

Following the public exhibition in May we have made some amendments to the Plans which are available in the office for all members to view.

Virtually all the information and professional Reports have now been obtained and we are hoping to submit the Planning Application for the development of 3 detached houses to the Council in late September. Plans for the new Clubhouse will be incorporated but purely to indicate our intentions for use of the sale proceeds from the land. Planning Permission for the new Clubhouse will not be applied for at least another year.

COURSE DRAINAGE

Every year we carry out additional drainage work on the course. This year the main concentration will be on the 9th fairway, which may have to be closed for a day or so.

We are hoping that the Contractors can carry out the work in Ground Maintenance Week but this is not certain yet.

PROPERTY DAMAGE OFF THE COURSE

We regularly get claims from our neighbours relating to damage caused by golf balls to their property. This is a significant cost to the Club as we have a £350 Excess applicable to this type of Insurance claim, and not many claims exceed this.

Recently there has been a dramatic increase in the number of claims for no obvious reasons – which have come from all sides of the course but mainly from the caravan park where there are often children playing. Please ensure that you shout fore loudly, apologise to those affected and report every incident in the relevant book in the foyer.

Clubhouse Hire

The clubhouse can be hired by members for events such as a birthday party . First call should be with the Club Steward and /or the Office to check

availability. There is a hire form that needs to be filled out (copies are available from the office) in advance of the event. Our caterers are to be used for any food requirements.

There is a charge for hire of £100.

MEMBERSHIP

Like most Golf Clubs we are always looking for new Members to replace those who move away or just get too old to play. Our average age is higher than most clubs, which has its effect on our membership.

We will therefore be advertising again this year from March onwards and our new Membership Director Richard Gremo is currently considering our advertising campaign with our President John Clarke. If anyone has any ideas please contact either of them – they will be pleased to hear from you.

We will also be offering a **£50 Incentive** to existing Members who introduce new Full Playing Members to the Club. Full details will be available soon – the incentive will be by way of a discount from the next year's subscription. There will be no limit to the number of incentives, which can be earned in any year. So introduce 10 Members for a free year!

Green Keepers Report

REPORT September 2015

Greens Report

After a very dry start to the spring the weather continued in much the same vein. Rainfall totals for subsequent months were:- June 12mm, July 43mm, and the beginning of August completely dry. However from the 11th to 31st inclusive and amazing 100mm fell on Whitstable.

When you consider that the total rainfall for the previous five and half months was 110mm it really was going from one extreme to the other. On the plus side we have had very good germination in a number of filled in drainage channels.

Greens have held up well with uniform surfaces. They have taken the recent rain remarkably well although I would appreciate some drier weather before they are vertidraind in maintenance week to achieve full benefit of the work. As mentioned earlier all last year's fairway drainage channels have been filled in. All fairways are due to be divotted when time permits. At present we are endeavouring to keep up with the prolific growth. We have incorporated a

single fairway height of cut around greens. The 9th temporary green is being refurbished with a top quality turf.

I have sprayed rescue herbicide on a few tees and the bank behind the 8th green with good results. More are due to be treated if conditions allow. During maintenance week there is drainage work scheduled for the 9th hole plus the carry on number 1.

Proposed winter work includes the usual bunker refurbishments plus levelling up of sunken areas around greens. I would like to strip and returf the 3 tees on 5th and 14th due to the very high percentage of perennial rye grass present. If I spray them with rescue there wouldn't be much left.

The 9th temporary green will be returfed this week (w/c 1st). Costs for repairing the post and rail fence adjacent to the car park are to be sought. The bore hole excavation is imminent. Discussion took place regarding concerns over the replacement netting next to the caravan park. It is hoped this will be resolved soon. Replacement of the diesel tank delivery hose to take place this week.

There is always concern over the age of our machinery. We must replace some of them as soon as good machines are found.

The water pipes ends in the dykes are on the "to do" list this winter.

Good comments have been received all round regarding the 14mm cut around the greens.
